From all these efforts, it is clear that we are moving towards a more formal and widespread use of social media in educational practice [49], [50], [51].

Soft skills belong to technology and academic fields, are more psychological, and so abstract [52], [53], [54]. Soft skills are a sociological term for the development of a person's emotional intelligence, which is a collection of personality traits, social sensitivity, communication, language, personal habits, friendliness and optimism characterizing relationships with other people [55], [56], [57]. Soft skills are the skills of one's relationship with others (interpersonal skills), and the ability to develop self- regulation skills (interpersonal skills) maximum work efficiency [58], [59], [60] while Hard skills, mastery of knowledge, technical and technical skills relevant to their knowledge [61], [62], [63]. Considering the importance of soft skills Work hard to shape the character of students [64], [65], [66].

Abdullah's findings (2012: 21) show an increase in students' understanding and mathematical expression Get situation-based learning Overall, soft skills (medium category) are higher than students who receive regular learning (low category) [67], [68], [69]. One of the learning modes that promises to improve students' soft skills in learning mathematics is generative learning [70], [71], [72]. Generative Learning is a learning model based on constructivism, emphasizing the active integration of new knowledge through the use of knowledge students already possess [73], [74], [75]. The generative learning model requires students to build knowledge actively and freely [76], [77], [78]. In addition, students also have the freedom to express thoughts or thoughts and reasons [79], [80], [81]. For questions given like this, students will better understand the knowledge they have developed themselves and the learning process will be more optimal [82], [83], [84].


RESULTS AND DISCUSSION
